Combining half marks

- FE20 Ɀ COMBINING LIGATURE LEFT HALF
 FE21 ⱽ COMBINING LIGATURE RIGHT HALF
 → 0361 Ɀⱽ combining double inverted breve
 FE22 ⱸ COMBINING DOUBLE TILDE LEFT HALF
 FE23 ⱹ COMBINING DOUBLE TILDE RIGHT HALF
 → 0360 ⱸⱹ combining double tilde

Continuous macrons for Coptic

These are used in combinations to represent continuous macrons over a sequence of Coptic letters.

- FE24 ⱺ COMBINING MACRON LEFT HALF
 FE25 ⱻ COMBINING MACRON RIGHT HALF
 FE26 ⱼ COMBINING CONJOINING MACRON
 → 0304 ⱼ combining macron
 → 035E ⱼ combining double macron

Combining half marks below

These are used in combinations to represent a ligature, tilde, or macron that extend underneath more than two characters.

- FE27 Ɀ̅ COMBINING LIGATURE LEFT HALF BELOW
 FE28 ⱽ̅ COMBINING LIGATURE RIGHT HALF BELOW
 → 035C Ɀ̅ⱽ̅ combining double breve below
 FE29 ⱸ̅ COMBINING TILDE LEFT HALF BELOW
 FE2A ⱹ̅ COMBINING TILDE RIGHT HALF BELOW
 FE2B ⱺ̅ COMBINING MACRON LEFT HALF BELOW
 FE2C ⱻ̅ COMBINING MACRON RIGHT HALF BELOW
 FE2D ⱼ̅ COMBINING CONJOINING MACRON BELOW
 → 0331 ⱼ̅ combining macron below
 → 035F ⱼ̅ combining double macron below

Combining half marks

These are used for supralineation in Church Slavonic texts.

- FE2E Ɀ̆ COMBINING CYRILLIC TITLO LEFT HALF
 FE2F ⱽ̆ COMBINING CYRILLIC TITLO RIGHT HALF
 → 0483 Ɀ̆ⱽ̆ combining cyrillic titlo
