

 - 11 Mar. 2010, 8 Apr. 2010, 13 May 2010, 10 Jun. 2010, 22 Jul. 2010, and 5 Aug 2010
 - Face-to-face meeting in Brussels at 22 Jun 2010 (during ICANN)
- Topics
 - 2010 ICANN Board of Directors Election
 - We selected Kuo Wei Wu.
 - We have no election next year, and try to improve ICANN board selection procedure
 - Time frame
 - current procedure is fragile a little bit. Need to make it more flexible

Global Policy Management

- Global Policy Proposal for the Allocation of IPv4 Blocks to Regional Internet Registries
 - Adopted in APNIC, LACNIC, AfriNIC and RIPE.
 - Adopted in ARIN with different text
 - ASO/AC decided this policy proposal failed to get global consensus and advised NRO EC about that last November.
- Global Policy for allocation of ASNs to RIRs
 - Adopted in all regions, and forwarded to ICANN board for ratification on 22 Jul.
 - Public comment period in ICANN was ended at 13 Aug.
- Global policy for IPv4 allocations by the IANA post exhaustion
 - Recognized as a global policy
 - Will be discussed in all regions
