

Connecting Document JavaScript to 3D Views

Acrobat 7 Professional contains a new tool, the 3D Tool which allows you to embed U₃(Universal 3D) objects in a PDF document. Once this 3D model is embedded in a PDF, it can be distributed and viewed by anyone with Acrobat or Adobe Reader 7.x

Assigning actions to control 3D objects

You can create an action to control an embedded 3D object from the PDF document. In Figure 1, there is colored text on the left which will be used to create hyperlinks from the text to display certain views in the 3D object.



The following steps outline how to create views for each required link.

- 1. Open the PDF.
- 2. Click inside the 3D object to activate it.
- 3. Manipulate the object until the correct view is displayed.
- 4. Right-click in the image and select Views > Manage Views... or select Manage Views... from the 3D toolbar.



5. Create a view in the Manage Views dialog box. Select OK.



6. Repeat the process to create all 3 views.

Once the views are created, you will need to create links in the PDF document to display each view. The following steps outline how to create the corresponding links:

- 1. Select the Link Tool.
- 2. Draw a marquee around the text to link.
- $3. \ \ Select \ "Invisible \ Rectangle" \ and \ "Custom \ Link" \ in \ the \ Create \ Link \ dialog \ box. \ Select \ Next.$



4. Select Actions tab. Select "Go to a 3D view" from the Section Action drop-down list. Select Add.



5. Select your 3D image from the list of annotations. Select the 3D View. For the first example, I will select Named view > firstbolt. Select OK. Close the Link Properties dialog box.



- 6. Select the Hand Tool and test your link.
- 7. Repeat for all links.
