NL PROVINCIAL HIGHLIGHTS



Introduction

MQO Research spoke with 400 residents of Newfoundland and Labrador to gauge the political temperature in the province for the Spring/Summer edition of our quarterly political poll: Atlantic Matters.

Provincial Politics

According to the latest polling numbers, Liberal support dropped from its peak in December of 2020, but they maintain a significant, 30-point lead over the PCs.

Among decided and leaning voters:

- Support for the Liberal Party decreased by 9 percentage points to 56%.
- o PC Party support rose 4 percentage points to 26%.
- NDP support also increased by 4 percentage points, to 15%
- o Support for the NL Alliance held steady at less than 1%.

The Atlantic Matters poll was conducted by telephone from June 12^{th} to July 10th, 2021, and included 400 randomly selected eligible voters from across the province. The margin of error for the total sample is \pm 4.9 percentage points 19 times out of 20.



vs. December 2020


