We understand the GAC's interest, as well as the broader community's interest, to be kept informed regarding the proposed change of control of Public Interest Registry (PIR) from the Internet Society (ISOC) to Ethos Capital. ICANN is committed to transparency and has continued to encourage maximum transparency from PIR, ISOC, and Ethos Capital in this matter.
