Federal Overview

Section 203 of the Voting Rights Act (VRA):

- Native American, Asian American, Alaskan Native, or Hispanic.
- Must equal to 10,000 citizens or make up 5% of the voting age of one of the protected groups and be Limited English Proficienct (LEP).
- Have an illiteracy rate higher than the national average.

Section 203 and Nevada

Section 203

- Clark County provides material in the following languages:
 - Spanish and Tagalog
- Nye County provides translation/interpretation services for all voting materials in:
 - Shoshone

Voluntarily:

 Washoe County provides bilingual sample ballots and ballots in English and Spanish.

U.S. Census Data and Nevada

- Nevada is diverse, and the 2020 Census ranked us as the third-most diverse state in the country.
- Fourth-largest population of residents who identify as Asian and Pacific Islander (AAPI) and the fifth-largest population who identify as Hispanic.
- 29.9% of the population speak a language other than English at home
- 19.2% of the population is foreign-born, with 51.9% of those being naturalized citizens.
- 471,016 Nevadans who are over the age of 18 reported a language other than English.
- 135, 442 Nevadans over the age of 18 are Limited English Proficient.

Nevada Top Languages and Limitations

- The top seven languages spoken in the state per the U.S. Census data are Spanish, Tagalog, Chinese, Vietnamese, Korean, Amharic, and Thai.
- Census data does not capture all languages spoken and only reports 42 languages. Examples include:
 - Persian includes Farsi and Darsi.
 - Amharic includes Somali or other African languages.
- Community collaboration is needed to identify other languages that are not currently being captured by the U.S. Census data.



- Recognizes that our state is diverse.
- Calls for inclusive policies to encourage participation to communities that have historically been disenfranchised from the ballot box.
- An opportunity to go beyond federal guidelines and help increase civic engagement and political participation for voters who don't speak English as their first language.
